Sex, and murder, for sale

Craigslist's seamy side among the mundane

Many people think of Craigslist as simply an online place to list your garage sale or find a job, but the site has a less-than-respectable side as well.

Craigslist is a hub of prostitution, sex rings and other illicit affairs, says Inspector John Burke, who heads the Albany County Sheriff's Department vice crimes

Since August 2007, more than 500 Craigslist-related crimes have been documented, according to Trench Reynolds, a Charlotte, N.C.,-based crime news blogger who has a section of his site dedicated to criminal activity on Craig-

With a stat like that, it's no surprise Burke calls Craigslist dangerous and discourages anyone from using it - even to buy a stroller or find a job.

What he considers most suspect: the personals. This portion is broken down into nine subcategories such as "strictly platonic," "women seeking men" and things like "casual encounters," ads for one-night stands

Pretty much everyone in the personal ads section is looking for one thing, says Burke: sex. Many times, paid sex. He cautions everyone to stay far, far away, saying unseemly people lurk in here and you never know what they may be capable of - violence, STD transmission murder

"It's an open-air sex market. All sex, all the time, 24-7," says Burke, who polices Craigslist for the Sheriff's Department. "No one in their right mind should be involved in

Murder charges shock **U**Albany classmates

ALBANY - Philip Markoff drew no attention from local police during his four years as an undergraduate student at UAlbany, and his arrest on charges he is the suspected Craigslist killer has left former classmates and friends shocked.

The 23-year-old Boston University medical student is accused of killing a woman he met through the Craigslist Web site and robbing another he met the same way. He was arrested Monday and arraigned Tuesday in Municipal Court in Boston where he remains held without bail.

"I thought he was a straight edge," said Ryan Meikle, a former college classmate of Markoff's who was his lab partner for several years. Meikle described Markoff as a "nerdy science lover," adding that he was "still in awe" over news his one-time classmate has been implicated in the high-profile case.

A critical piece of evidence used in Markoff's arrest was his IP address, which investigators traced using his correspondence with the women over the Internet, according to Jake Wark, press officer for the Suffolk County District Attor-

An archived Craigslist posting tracked by the Times Union also seems to indicate that Markoff had at one time posted his own advertisements offering massage services
